I suggest some improvement: A diagram of cell cycle disorders documenting the different steps of urea cycle should be added for a better understanding of the reader. Even if is a case report the references should be updated, particularly concerning the papers treating the different types of genetic abnormalities. To indicate a liver transplantation should we only consider the ammonia degree and the clinical symptoms in addition to the patient age or the different metabolic disorders have different clinical patterns of therapy?
