Nice and timely review. Only minor style corrections are needed: 1:- The expression “...a large minority...” seems an oxymoron 2.- Some commas may need to be added as in (when commenting Tofacitinib): “... with IL-6 and interferon-gamma down regulation,



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but additional data..." or "A few years ago, a phase II clinical trial..." 3.- The abbreviation "vs" is sometimes, but not always, written in italics. It should be consistently written all over the text
