COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

This is a sound case report of pancreatic schwannoma successfully treated by spleen-preserving distal pancreatectomy. The manuscript is well prepared which does not surprise me since the authors published a very similar case report just several months ago in the same journal. I would leave it up to the editorial board to decide whether this is appropriate or not. The summary of the published 65 cases is now only 3 cases more with 68 that are summarized. I would encourage the authors to look into their hospital records and aim for a case series just in case they plan to report on another pancreatic schwannoma in the nearby future. Another point worth looking into: Are there cases of minimally invasive surgery for schwannoma? Can the authors comment on that?
