Gastric paresis is divided into eight symptoms in traditional Chinese medicine, and deficiency of spleen and stomach qi is one of the most common symptoms. Some studies point out that only traditional Chinese medicine treatment has limited efficacy, and traditional Chinese medicine nursing intervention can further improve the efficacy and promote rehabilitation. In this study, the authors analyzed the clinical effect of traditional Chinese medicine nursing intervention in the treatment of gastric paraplegia with spleen stomach deficiency syndrome. This study is well designed and the results are interesting. Minor comments: 1. The manuscript requires a minor editing. Some minor language polishing should be revised. 2. The limit of this study should be discussed. 3. The references should be edited with PMID and DOI number, according to the journal's guideline.
