Because, (1) though, you state the patient has only gastrointestinal symptoms, there is no any gastrointestinal symptoms described in the context, and there is no any evidence for gastrointestinal infection provided; (2) all the evidence you obtained indicate your case is a patient of asymptomatic COVID-19 pneumonia.
