SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

In recent years, research on acute cerebral infarction has not only focused on the effects of the infarction on the body, but also the psychological effects. In this study, authors analyzed the factors affecting the mental health of patients with ACI by questionnaire survey of 220 patients with ACI, hoping to find out the key factors affecting the mental health. They found that long disease course may be the main factor leading to psychological problems in patients, and female patients with a high incidence of emotional disorders are more likely to have psychological problems. Such groups require more attention and psychological counseling. The experiment of the study is designed very well, aims are very clear. Methods are reasonable. Data in tables are very good, and well discussed. Finally, the manuscript also reviewed previous related literature. However, for effects of demographic sociological characteristics on mental health and Effects of ACI on mental health, Information that is not important (e.g., the difference is not statistically significant) may no longer be described in the text. Results have clearly presented in Tables 4 and 5.

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SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

This study investigated the factors affecting the mental health of patients with ACI. The SAS score and SDS score in the 220 patients with ACI included in this study were statistically significant. The results of univariate analysis showed that gender, age, residence, course of disease, number of chronic diseases and smoking history were the primary elements influencing the anxiety score in patients with ACI. Age, living conditions, monthly income, course of disease and knowledge of ACI were primary elements influencing the depression score in patients with ACI. The study concluded that long disease course and female patients with ACI were more likely to have psychological problems such as a high incidence of emotional disorders. The tables help the readers to make a more understanding of the study; however, some concerns have been noted including: Comments 1: It is not necessary to describe so many results that can be clearly seen in the table. Comments 2: It is suggested that the table can be more optimized, and some contents in the table need to be improved, for example: should the Mean in the first row of table 3 be Mean ± SD?
