The authors described a rare veterinary infectious disease caused by Eurytrema. As PubMed search returns only 2 papers, there are very little study published so far. Although clinical diseases caused by Eurytrema infections have not been reported, this bug can be transmitted to human. With global warming and increasing human populations in the world, it is important for public health to keep our eyes on like this infection. Thus, there is absolutely no doubt that this review appeals the significance of this research area to scientific community as well as to general public. Major comments 1. There is an apparently very relevant article published in 2006 (C.A. Bassani et al. (2006) Vet. Parasitol., 141, 356-361 "Epidemiology of eurytrematosis (Eurytrema spp. Trematoda: Dicrocoeliidae) in slaughtered beef cattle from the central-west region of the State of Paraná, Brazil." The authors should cite this paper and discuss in the text. Minor comments 1. Abstract: "Human infection has already...but clinical disease in human". Human infection of what? Same on "clinical disease" caused by what? Let's make the sentence clearer. 2. I think it is great to have a native English speaker to make sure that clarity of writing and all wording (choice of words) are polished. Nevertheless, the manuscript is generally well-written.
