COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

This is an important case report of a most unusual embryonal tumour involving the duodenum and adjacent pancreas and needs publication. However before being considered for publication it requires careful editing and revision. In many places the English is not idiomatic or the meaning could be made clearer. For instance in the 'Abstract' it would be clearer if the second sentence were worded - "Gastrosocopy revealed a circumferential vegetating lesion in the second part of the duodenum extending into an ulcerated indurated lesion in the third part resulting in a tight stenosis". In the description giving details of the operation the terms 'hepatic pedicle', 'hepatic falciform artery', 'pancreatic arches' and 'retroportal blade' do not correspond with anatomical terms to be found in 'Grays Anatomy', and make the description hard to follow. It is also stated that the pancreatic duct was anastomosed to the stomach but no mention is made of the bile duct. OTHER COMMENTS:- Abbreviations when first mentioned should be given in full. Figure 2. Figure A needs to be described in more detail in the caption with arrows pointing to the described features. Figure B. Arrows pointing to the described features are needed. Figure 3. The details are hard to discern and descriptive arrows are needed pointing to the features described in the caption. Figure

The patient presented with an iron deficiency anemia associated with asthenia and epigastric pain. Following pancreaticoduodenectomy, the results of histological findings were strongly indicative of a duodenal embryonal carcinoma with pancreatic infiltration.
