COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

This study is laboriously and has a correct methodology. The results are interesting and lead to the idea of the health education of the population, which alone can change her perception about irritable bowel. Concerns of a large number of respondents for certainty diagnosis of irritable bowel without conducting additional examinations may be a message also for the medical world, in the sense of a more precise definition of the criteria of irritable bowel (an improvement of Rome III criteria). There are some grammar mistakes, that should be corrected (sibjects - subjects - pag 12; this study's results - these study's results - pag 13; occation - occasion - pag 19). This article is useful for clinicians and worth to be published.
