Please provide more information on the patient's clinical symptoms and history before the presentation. What were the medications that the patient was in use? Was there anything remarkable in the patient's medical history? Was any exceptional childhood infection? 4. The final diagnosis should not only be chorea. The inclusion of the cause of chorea should be described. 5. What are the explanations for the development of vasculitis in cases of SLE? It is advised to be specific. 6. Could the authors provide a table with other cases with similar presentations from the literature? Or could they provide a table with the prevalence of chorea found in the studies? 7. New idea to describe in the discussion. Among the rheumatologic disorders, what makes SLE unique regarding the development of chorea?
