Treatment Approach to Pregnant woman with the diagnosis of Inflammatory bowel disease
COMMENT: Use upper case letters uniformly for the start of all the words of the title. The word 'woman' would better be 'women'. The topic is interesting; however, it is too long and redundant. The review should better be wrapped up and a maximum of 60 references (not 1550) would be sufficient to present this review properly. An ample portion of the abstract and introduction are on the relation of IBD to fertility and not just pregnancy. The title of the review could thus be adjusted to include referral to this also important topic considered within the review. The same applies to breastfeeding. The 2 presented tables are very broad and non-specific; they are concerned regarding any pregnant or breastfeeding woman. Considering better subheadings would be more appealing to focus on the mentioned drugs properly. An introductory paragraph or list before mentioning all the different therapeutic approaches would be impressive.

COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

This article reviews the care of IBD during pregnancy. In abstract the statement "subjects such as fertility, pregnancy and breastfeeding in IBD patients are hot topics" should be deleted. In introduction the following sentence need to be modified "Fertility rates (as lifetime births per woman) in IBD patients are relatively low compared to the general population (2.06, 2.45 respectively" Please delete the semicolon in the following sentence" In this article; our main objective is to clarify the management of IBD patients during pregnancy by reviewing the effects of IBD treatment on fertility, pregnancy period, fetus, lactation and infant." At many other places in the article a space is needed between two words. In the section on thiopurines and breast feeding, the following sentence need to be reframed "However, mothers of infants with weak immune systems should be advised to be cautious while breastfeeding during thiopurine treatment[81]." What exactly do the authors imply? The following sentence need to be corrected grammatically "Despite studies that reported low-dosage parenteral methotrexate usage has no connection with negative pregnancy outcomes, manufacturers usually recommend men stopping taking this drug three months preconception[85,86]." The



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following sentence needs to be rewritten " If colonoscopy is performed during the first trimester, it has a risk of spontaneous abortion and premature birth when performed during the thirdtrimester[134]." Overall, this is an extensive and a good review. Authors should high what has changed recently. Grammar needs attention
