Compared with an earlier version of the article, the manuscript has been revised. The authors have clearly presented the description of the ORTO-15 questionnaire (ORTO-15 and sub-scores). The study used the multidimensional Body-Body Relationship Questionnaire (MBSRQ) and the Body Anxiety Test (BUT)), psychological distress (Kessler Psychological Distress Scale, K10), physical activity (International Physical Activity Questionnaire, IPAQ), attitudes toward food (Eating Attitudes Test, EAT-26), and malnutrition (Starvation Symptom Inventory, SSI). Gender differences, within the same country, and differences between Italian and Spanish students, within the same gender, were assessed, and the study was conducted on 160 students in Rome and Murcia.
