According to the title this review pretends to be "an update", but in my opinion this aim was not achieved. Many of the references cited by the authors are over 5 to 10 year-old, or even more old, for example, in the Core Tip authors say "This paper reviews the most recent evidence on hepatocarcinoma including its molecular pathogenesis", the references are so old as 1996 or 1997, all this articles have been cited in other reviews and guidelines, then the present review not achieved the aim to be an update. On the other hand, most of the more recent references cited by the authors 2010 - 2014 are also review articles, one of them even was published in World J Gastroenterology recently. but they did not include original studies related to pathogenesis, diagnosis and new therapeutic options. This review do not provides additional important information different from what is already described in guidelines.

1) Update references

Response: We completely agree. We rewrite de whole section with update information and add information about de specific molecular biology to the development of hepatocellular carcinoma in HCV and HBV. Recent evidence was added on the possibility that despite antiviral therapy for HBV, hepatocarcinoma high risk persists (even though complete response to treatment).

2) Include original articles studies

Response: We completely agree. We included recent original articles, particularly of molecular pathogenesis accordingly with reviewer`s recommendations.

We can summarize the three images into a single image? 3. The figures are made ??by the authors? or are primary sources? have permissions? Figures can be summarized into one? 4. I ??strongly suggest updating the literature, 50% is more than five years. The review is an update? Very old References

1) It should be considered mini-review

Response: We appreciate the suggestion. References, images and figures have been reduced, keeping the manuscript review length with the intention that it not has the extension of a mini-review.

2) Summarize the three images into a single image

Response: We reduced only to a diagnosis images showing the typical behavior of hepatocarcinoma and treatment related images were removed. These images are from patients of our Institution.

3) Figures are made? by the authors or primary sources? Permissions?

Response: The figures are for primary sources; all of them have been reproduced and modified with permissions of authors and editorials. We believe it is necessary to keep the three figures and should not reduce them to one due to the following reasons:

Show diagnostic algorithms both Eastern and Western International Associations these two approaches are rarely displayed in a single article.

About Figure 3 (BCLC staging system) we have considered relevant keep it because determines the steps to take decisions on the treatment of patients with hepatocellular carcinoma.

4) Updating literature
