This work is very interesting and the whole manuscript is well drafted, however, some concerns have been noted including: 1. Some minor language polishing should be corrected. 2. Explain the abbreviations when they appear the first time, such as SDS, SAS, KPS... 3. The format of references should be modified.

The manuscript is very well written. Although routine nursing can play a certain role, it is difficult to achieve good results because of the lack of a persistent and systematic approach, and the integrated nursing approach to medical care can guide patients to relax their whole body and heart by recalling interesting things in past life, taking deep breath and so on, to relieve negative emotions such as depression and anxiety. The implementation of integrated medical care increased communication between doctors and nursing staff, fully mobilized all positive factors, helped to stabilize the mood of patients, and enhanced patient confidence to overcome the disease. In addition, integrated nursing care breaks down the relationship between nurses and patients and reconstructs the three-way relationship of patient, nursing and medical treatment. Comments: 1. Abstract. The background is missing. 2. The methods are described in detail. Inclusion and exclusion criteria are clear. 3. Results are very interesting. The data in tables are excellent. 4. Discussion. The results were well discussed, with latest references. 5. References. The references should be revised according to the format. 6. Some minor language polishing required a minor editing.
