I have some minor comments. \* Please add page and line numbers. \* In the EPIDEMIOLOGY AND PREVALENCE section, why have the authors discussed up to 2016 and not more recent years? \* Please explain how table 1 was evaluated and prepared? \*The inflasome section needs to be discussed in more detail. What about the impact of other cytokines and inflammatory mediators? The Adaptive Immunity section does not describe sufficiently the role of alcohol consumption on T cells and rather explains more the TH17 subfamily of T cells.
