COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

This case study by Xinangfei et al., concerns a 56-year-old female patient with primary hepatic neuroendocrine tumor (PHNET) with a confirmed 26-year survival before surgery. This rare case of PHNET should be of interest to scholars of hepatology and surgery since this represents the longest reported survival time before surgical treatment. The manuscript is generally well written and should be revised before acceptance as follows: 1. The second sentence in the Abstract should be "Here we report a case of PHNET with a confirmed 26-year survival before surgery." 2. The last sentence of the Abstract should be revised to "This case represents the longest reported survival time for a PHNET patient before removal of her tumor." 3. The legend to Figure 4 is MISLABELED as Figure 5. 4. To make this manuscript more reader-friendly, the common clinical jargon should be minimized. The authors should explain all



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ABBREVIATIONS. 5. In the last but one paragraph beginning with “To the best of our knowledge.....” , the “will be AN previously unreported feature.” AN should be replace by “a”
