Please note the following:

- 1- This manuscript is the most comprehensive review on the topic to date. It covers the basic science aspects, the current clinical knowledge and then provides clinical recommendation based on the most recent literature. What seems to be a bit of redundancy is actually the *application* of the basic or clinical research facts in the recommendation section "positioning patients for spine surgery". Because this article is primarily for clinicians, including all current knowledge in a meaningful clinically relevant recommendation necessitated presenting the basic science and evidence based clinical foundation for the recommendation. This may have created what seems to be a redundancy, while it is not, it is actually very important to provide a complete review.
