SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

It is a very interesting case report. However, it needs major revision, especially regarding the timeline of the events. It is extremely hard to follow - and prove - things that have happened in 1981, i.e. more than forty years from now. I highly appreciate this serious attempt, but documenting medical problems of forty years before is a problem. Furthermore, medicine was not at the actual level of sophistication. The sequence of events - as described - is even more bizarre: The patient, a nulliparous female (G1, P0) of unspecified occupation, exhibited normal development and was born on March 27, 1973.......... So you, initially speak about nulliparity, than give the date of birth ?? Please mind the calendar.... Even more, giving precise details (date of birth etc....) might lead to unacceptable ethical issue due to potential identification of the patient. Ensure anonimity. The formule regarding menstruation is not understandable. Figure 1 is overlapped and unclear: please separate these into two-three clear insets.
