## **SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS**

Thank you to the authors for this most interesting case report. It is an important contribution to the literature, particularly for those caring for patients with inflammatory bowel disease. Bringing attention to rare disease presentations, as this case report does, is extremely valuable. There are significant language issues throughout the abstract and manuscript. For this to be published in English, I believe it will require major editing. Some examples: 1. "disease of the bowel that causes any aspect of the colon) 2."once tend to be diagnosed" 3. "lot of blood can be seen under colonoscopy" 4. "is rare to be known and may detect a new look sight" 5."are closely resemble" 6. "ineffective to alliviate" 7. "in the long past years" 8. "it is noticeable," 9. "there are more to be explored" Other comments: 1. Do you have endoscopy or histology images from later in the patient's course, when they are clinically doing well? Would be helpful to compare. 2. Do you use any grading system for patient's symptoms or for the endoscopy images? Mayo Endoscopic Score (MES) and Ulcerative Colitis Endoscopic Index of Severity (UCEIS) are two examples. Again, would be helpful to compare score at presentation with score at 26 months. 3. Are there any genetic markers associated with GDUC?
