The case is well-prepared, informative, concise. The description of the patient and the illustrative material are excellent. However, there are some issues that can be improved:

1. The short title is not relevant to the paper. 2. "novel coronavirus virus pneumonia (named COVID-19)" - npt scientific true, it is SARS-CoV-2, not simply pneumonia 3. Think for changing the title by including the word "prognosis" 4. The references have to be adjusted, ex. "even multiple organ dysfunction (MODS) [4] [7]" - [4,7] 5. It is difficult to predict the long-term well-being of the patient on the basis only of the ESR. Please, adjust your last paragraph in discussion and in conclusion.
