Reviewer 00742507: No revisions demanded.

Reviewer 02682232: This is good but you need have material collection method and experimental lab and Analyzing significant OR: have a good collection by Meta-analysis.

Response: Our work is a narrative review. So we composed our manuscript based on that guideline. At moment very limited randomized studies are available for meta-analysis. We will consider it in the future.

Reviewer 02683307: No revisions demanded

Reviewer 03001454: These discussions are largely not in-depth, and there is hardly any new insight we could see in the authors' understanding about apoptosis and related consideration in the cancer therapy.

Response: We searched all the recent advancements in this topic using all online searching data bases. However, data regarding role of apoptosis in colorectal cancer are very rare. We tried to collect all the available evidences and organize it for further researches and considerations.

In addition, in terms of the detail of this review, there are quite a few mistakes of grammar and sentence structures.

Response: Grammar and sentence structures mistakes were corrected by authors and native speakers.


