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CASE PRESENTATION

A 62-year-old female presented to our hematology clinic with previously diagnosed hereditary hemorrhagic telangiectasia (HHT). The patient had lifelong complications associated with this illness, including recurrent epistaxis and pulmonary arteriovenous malformations (AVMs).
