Inherited Neurological Disorder

Primary familial brain calcification, also known as familial idiopathic basal ganglia calcification and Fahr's disease, is a rare, genetically dominant inherited neurological disorder characterized by abnormal deposits of calcium in areas of the brain that control movement. Through the use of CT scans, calcifications are seen primarily in the basal ganglia and in other areas such as the cerebral cortex.
