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Invasive aspergillosis presenting as hilar masses with stenosis of bronchus: A case report

Abstract

BACKGROUND

Hilar masses with stenosis of bronchus occur mainly due to malignant diseases, such as lung cancer. Hilar masses resulting from invasive aspergillosis (IA) are extremely rare and occur mostly in severely immunosuppressed patients.

CASE SUMMARY

In the current case report, we have documented a unique case of IA presenting as a mass in hilum and bronchial stenosis under bronchoscopy, mimicking lung cancer in a 54-year-old man with diabetes mellitus. The histological analysis of bronchial membrane biopsy demonstrated fungal elements of 45° branching hyphae with positive Periodic Acid-Schiff and

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CXR showed a **mass** in the right upper **hemithorax** arising from the pleura, a right pleural effusion, small bilateral nodules and left upper lobe collapse. CT of the chest also revealed subcarinal and left **hilar lymph nodes**, bilateral effusions and a left **hilar mass** compressing the descending pulmonary artery.
