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There are very few **case reports** of **esophageal tuberculosis** presenting with hematemesis due to **esophageal** ulceration. We **report** a patient with hematemesis that was later attributed to the erosion of tuberculous subcarinal lymph nodes into the esophagus.

Esophageal tuberculosis presenting with hematemesis

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This is a case report of a rare form of tuberculosis in a patient presenting with dysphagia. Patient was subjected to upper gastrointestinal endoscopy, which revealed an ulcerative growth in the distal **esophagus**. Histopathology revealed **esophageal tuberculosis**. Patient was managed conservatively with Anti-Tuberculosis Treatment (ATT).

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We present a rare case of **esophageal tuberculosis** causing odynophagia. Tuberculosis of the **esophagus** is a rare condition, even in countries with a high incidence of tuberculosis (TB) and studies estimate that it constitutes about 0.3% of gastrointestinal TB cases.
