Neoadjuvant therapy is the administration of therapeutic agents before a main treatment. One example is neoadjuvant hormone therapy prior to radical radiotherapy for adenocarcinoma of the prostate. Neoadjuvant therapy aims to reduce the size or extent of the cancer before using radical treatment intervention, thus both making procedures easier and more likely to succeed and reducing the consequences of a more extensive treatment technique,

Cancer of pancreas, an organ which is behind the lower part of the stomach. This causes abdominal pain, jaundice, itchy skin, fatigue and weight loss.

- Rare (Fewer than 200,000 cases per year in US)
- Often requires lab test or imaging
- Treatable by a medical professional
- Can last several months or years

The exact cause of pancreatic cancer is unknown. Risk factors include diabetes, chronic pancreatitis and stomach ulcer. In the early stage, it is asymptomatic. Common symptoms at later stages are weight loss and abdominal pain. Treatment depends on the location of tumor, age and general health. Treatment includes surgery, chemotherapy and radiation.
