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15 Only 1 patient of 8 with an NK/T **cell lymphoma** had paranasal **sinus** alone involvement, whereas only 3 of 15 patients with **diffuse large B-cell lymphoma** had the primary site as the nasal cavity. These results suggest that lymphomas of the nasal cavity may have a different cellular **origin** with a predilection for NK/T **cell origin**.
