Adrenocortical cancer (ACC) is a rare malignancy with mostly bad prognosis. Most cases are diagnosed late, in the presence of distant metastases (1–8). The medical treatment options for ACC are rather limited, as mitotane is the only available drug specific for the adrenal cortex and its use associated with severe side effects and a narrow therapeutic range (1). Systemic combination chemotherapy with EOP protocol (etoposide, doxorubicine, cisplatin) improves survival (2), but the only hope for cure is still
