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 Gastrointestinal bleeding from ³Dieulafoy's lesion: Clinical presentation, endoscopic findings, and endoscopic therapy

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Abstract

Although relatively uncommon, ⁹Dieulafoy's lesion is an important cause of acute gastrointestinal bleeding due to the frequent difficulty in its diagnosis; its tendency to cause severe, life-threatening, recurrent gastrointestinal bleeding; and its amenability to life-saving endoscopic therapy. Unlike normal vessels of the gastrointestinal tract which become progressively smaller in caliber peripherally, Dieulafoy's lesions maintain a large caliber despite their peripheral,

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
