### Abstract

At 13 years of follow-up, the European Randomized Study of Screening for Prostate Cancer (ERSPC) shows a 21% decrease in prostate cancer deaths in the PSA-screened group compared to control. This difference increases to 27% when non compliance is taken into account.
