Stressors During Childhood and Adolescence and Their Psychological Sequelae. The most widely studied stressors in children and adolescents are exposure to violence, abuse (sexual, physical, emotional, or neglect), and divorce/marital conflict (see Cicchetti 2005). Apr 28, 2021 · We hypothesize that objective **exposure** to COVID-19 hardship will be more strongly associated with poor child development among **stress-susceptible** individuals (who also show high levels of subjective **stress** and psychological distress) than among **stress-resilient** individuals (who have low levels of subjective **stress** and psychological distress despite high **exposure** to objective hardship).

May 19, 2020 · There is a great deal of overlap between moral injury and **posttraumatic stress disorder** (PTSD). Both begin with an event that is often life threatening or harmful to self or others. Guilt and shame are core features of moral injury and are also symptoms of PTSD.

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
