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In this report, we present a rare case of *Klebsiella pneumoniae*-associated Lemierre's syndrome in a patient with poorly-controlled diabetes mellitus. The infection was complicated by septic emboli in many organs, which led to the patient's death, despite combined antibiotics, anticoagulant therapy, ...

Symptoms Diagnosis

Lemierre's syndrome refers to infectious thrombophlebitis of the internal jugular vein. It most often develops as a complication of a bacterial sore throat infection in young, otherwise healthy adults. The thrombophlebitis is a serious condition and may lead to further systemic complications such as bacteria in the blood or septic emboli.

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Lemierre's syndrome

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Apr 03, 2012 - The condition was better described by Andre Lemierre in 1936 from a report of 20 cases. The hallmark of the syndrome, as was originally described by Lemierre, is a tetrad of acute oropharyngeal infection, septicemia, thrombophlebitis of the ipsilateral internal jugular vein (IJV), and secondary metastatic abscesses, most commonly to the lungs and joints.
