Page 8 “On hospital day (HD) 3, test results showed improvement, which were as follows: CRP level increased to 5.71 mg/dL and AST and ALT levels to 85 U/L and 198 U/L” sounds a little bit awkward. 4. Why did you detect the level of BNP? Did the patient have new symptoms during the treatment? 5. The manuscript should be reviewed as there are multiple sentences in which the grammar/sentence structure is incorrect and this is confusing.
