This case is interesting because it reflects one of the rare complications of autoimmune pancreatitis. Abbreviations of all explanations should be stated in the first place. Direct abbreviations are used in the abstract. In the first line of the sixth page, ICDC is used as a direct abbreviation, the meaning of ICDC was not explained beforehand. Since there is splenic vein thrombosis, it is recommended to mention whether anticoagulants have a place in the treatment in the discussion part.
