Dear authors: Thank you very much for your effort and work to be able to present this clinical case. First of all, I must tell you that it is a good work, but I would like you to clarify certain aspects: - Why there is no section on the patient's history. As the patient is referred from another hospital, he/she should bring with him/her a clinical history and talk about his/her previous pathologies and previous interventions. It is essential to know in this case what diagnostic tests were carried out previously, cranial interventions and medical treatments prescribed. - What do they mean by "Traditional Chinese Concept". In the discussion they refer to this concept but it is commented on previously and they do not specify it. Make reference to it being explained later. - The discussion section is very brief and you should make more reference to your objective and finding of the clinical case and interrelate it with current literature. - In the references section there are 13 citations, it is quite poor and there should be more current citations, please improve this section. - You should make reference to your finding with this clinical case and make it evident to the whole scientific community because otherwise there is hardly any novel contribution with your work. I hope you will take my comments and contributions into account, thank you. Regards
