However, it would be deficient that the authors did not mention the examination findings of the other cranial nerves in some cases. The facial nerve and the vestibular nerve examination were essential to be examined.

The language needs improvement. There are many grammar and spelling errors. Refer to the attached file for correction. 2. Timeline of this report is not organized in a table or figure form. Table 1 doesn't fit well in describing the timeline clearly. 3. For case 2 and 3: All figure sections are not cited in text. 4. For case 3: It seems that figures are wrongly cited at some places.
