The authors present a report of primary renal small cell carcinoma: a case report with literature review. The authors report a case of primary renal small cell carcinoma and discussed its fast-changing clinical progress, treatment process, and long-term effect. However, some of important issues need to be verified to improve your work as following. 1. Please provide summary update data of clinical manifestation, diagnosis and treatment of primary renal small cell carcinoma from the previous reports. 2. The first case of primary renal small cell carcinoma (SCC) was reported by Capella et al. in 1984. Since then, approximately 50 cases of renal SCC (including 13 cases of small cell carcinoma of the renal pelvis) have been described. (PMID: 22084805, PMID: 12627507). It is important that within the manuscript, the authors clarify the importance of this work, how it differs from and advances previously published work and how this article can benefit the field and patients in the future etc. Please also add more information from recently published research and offer a more speculative and forward-looking perspective. 3. Systematic reviews and meta-analyses are considered to be the highest quality evidence on a research topic because their study design reduces bias and produces more reliable findings. Please add evidence from recent systematic review and meta-analysis. 4. Finally, since I am not a native English user, I did not check for typo errors and grammatical errors thoroughly. This should be done by an appropriate language reviewer.
