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#### **SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS**

This is an interesting case of brachial nerve palsy related to hematoma in a hemophiliac patient. The case is informative but will need modifications. Firstly, the abstract need not be structured and divided into several sections. Rather, a short paragraph for the abstract should be sufficient. Similarly, case presentation is divided into several headings like Hx of present illness and past medical Hx etc. The case presentation should be in a flow and in the form of few paragraphs only. Please try to modify it. Also, elaborate on the physical exam findings to describe the nerve areas involved rather than just saying e.g medial forearm was involved. Under surgical description you have referred to the lesion as "tumor" while referring to it as a mass or lesion will be more appropriate.
