Radialogical description is not adequate in particular CT findings should be reported as direct and/or indirects signs (see 10.1148/rg.2021200077). Furthermore, the authors should explain why Magnetic resonance cholangiopancreatography was not performed as prior examination after Ct for the evaluation of the pancreratic duct intregrity.
