The case presentation is quite long with an excessive description of the patient recovery. Please summarize the most important data. Radiological description is not adequate in particular CT findings should be reported as direct and/or indirect signs (see 10.1148/rg.2021200077). Furthermore, the authors should explain why Magnetic resonance cholangiopancreatography was not performed as prior examination after Ct for the evaluation of the pancreatic duct integrity.
