The authors also highlight problems in management such as differential diagnosis. Conclusions are drawn up according to the results. This manuscript is well written but improvements need to be made in the discussion because the author includes various theories but lacks in discussing the case that the author analyzes. What are the questions that drive this research for the author to do next? How can this publication impact basic science and/or clinical practice? The author does not include limitations in this manuscript. The future of this topic is described as the basis for further research on the potential of vulvovaginal myeloid sarcoma with massive pelvic floor



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infiltration compared to its vaginal appearance alone. This is certainly heavy for women's quality of life. In clinical practice, these findings support efforts to detect early pelvic floor sarcoma expansion. The question is how to specifically distinguish this differential diagnosis precisely so that further research is needed.
