The authors cite a case of PRES caused by tumor-associated antibodies (Barber E, BMC Neurol 2020) and describe a possibility of a similar factor in the case of SongCH et al. There is no problem with the description, and a search for tumor-associated antibodies may be necessary, along with hypercalcemia. One point I cannot understand. The authors (Suljo Kunic et al.) refer to the Barber et al. case as "our case," but none of the authors of this text are the authors of the Barber et al. case report. What is the relationship between the Barber et al.'s case and the authors?

Authors speculate that posterior reversible encephalopathy syndrome may be caused by paraneoplastic antibodies, tumors or even antitumor therapy, per se, in addition to the hypercalcemia postulated by Song CH et al in “Posterior reversible encephalopathy syndrome (PRES) in a patient with metastatic breast cancer: A case report” (World Journal of Clinical Cases, March 2022).
