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SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

The manuscript “Rare case of pancreatic metastasis from renal cell carcinoma: case report and review of literature” by Liang XK et al. presents an interesting case report, namely a case of isolated pancreatic metastasis from renal cell cancer (isPM-RCC) diagnosed 19 years after a left nephrectomy performed for a misinterpreted clear-cell renal cell carcinoma (ccRCC). The manuscript is concise and well written. - The core tip should however be rewritten due to a bad English translation. - The discussion is appropriate, although I would suggest that the authors devote a longer paragraph to newly developed systemic therapies of metastatic renal cell carcinoma, both in association with surgical resection and as an effective treatment for unresectable tumors. - The English language should be revised. However, as the authors state in their discussion, about 800 cases of isPM-RCC have been reported since 1952, and this case report adds very little to a relatively well-known topic.
