In the Case Report entitled "A rare case of primary extracranial meningioma of the maxillary sinus presenting as buccal swelling associated with headache: a case report", the Authors describe a case of extracranial meningioma in the paranasal sinuses successfully managed by surgical treatment without evident post-surgery complications. The paper is well written and structured following CARE checklist. I suggest enriching the literature by adding the following papers: 1) doi.org/10.1155/2018/7541892 and 2) PMID: 19155678. Furthermore, I suggest adding a table in which the Authors summarize all published reports of primary extracranial meningioma specifying: 1) first Author, 2) year of publication, 3) site of primary extracranial meningioma, 4) diagnostic tests (such as CT and / or MR imaging), 4) histology and 5) treatment performed. This table would allow the Reader an at a glance evaluation of the available literature.
