Dear Author(s), thank you for your manuscript. This is a highly important topic, especially now due to ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. However, to the best of my knowledge your article has several omissions. It is lacking in data especially regarding all potential pathophysiological mechanisms linking obesity and increased COVID-19 severity, e.g. more data regarding obesity-related low-grade chronic inflammation, higher expression of angiotensin converting enzyme-2 and pathway-associated components, as well as decreased vitamin D bioavailability, and gut microbiome dysbiosis. Thus, for instance you may refer to E.g. 10.1016/j.obmed.2020.100259.; 10.1016/j.obmed.2020.100302. At the present time major revision is needed. Best regards, Rewiever.
