The article describes a very interesting case of driven hypereosinophilia. I believe it should be emphasized in the text that mutations in the rearrangements of the FIP1L1 and PDGFR-alpha genes were investigated for clonal hypereosinophilic syndromes, especially in the context of the absence of histopathological diagnosis.
