However, it would be beneficial for the authors to highlight what is particularly unique or educational about this case, what it will add to the surgical literature, as well as what the purposes and objectives are. 1. It would be beneficial if the introduction is a little shorter and only focuses on the of the 2. It would be useful detail presentation to the case medical/surgical/family/psychosocial/pharmacological history of the patient 3. Detail the immediate postoperative course. Were there complications during or after surgery? What was the operative time? Did the patient receive blood transfusions? 4. It would be convenient to detail the post-surgical control and follow-up. 5. In the discussion they do not mention other cases reported in the literature, contrasting the findings of this one with the rest. 6. It would be better to mention that it makes this case unique with others reported in the literature. 7. It would be much more interesting if they did a review of the literature and put together a table with similar cases so far
