Article is well written; however, few improvements are needed. 1. Authors have mentioned that no etiology exists, however, at another place they have mentioned PIK3CA mutation. Kindly modify the article accordingly. PIK3CA-related overgrowth spectrum (PROS) should be described in brief. 2. The diagnosis of filariasis cannot be made given the clinical presentation. Authors make make necessary amendments in the title and the text. 3. Authors should discuss the findings, classification, and diseases following the ISSVA classification. 4. Visceral involvement is about 1% 5. Authors cannot be certain that it is the first case report. They should mention that according to their literature search, they could not find any other similar case.
