Dear editors and authors of the manuscript "Cauda equina calcification: A case report", thank you for the opportunity to read the described clinical case. The disease is rare, which determines the relevance of the topic. The authors well described the history of the disease prior to hospitalization, the general and neurological status of the patient, as well as data from imaging diagnostic methods. The title of the manuscript, abstract, keywords fully reflect the content. Add "Post-traumatic Cauda equina calcification" to the title and keywords, because the basis for the development of the disease is described in the anamnesis. Especially the authors need to work out the "Discussion" section: 1. There are repeated sentences "Nerve calcification is usually found in the cerebral and dental nerves, and the cause is usually degenerative disease, infection, etc[3]. Nerve calcification is usually found in the cerebral and dental nerves, and the cause is usually degenerative disease, infection, etc[3]. The cause is usually degeneration, infection, etc" and "It has also been suggested that IBCG is associated with carbonic anhydrase II deficiency [12][13]". 2. In the pathogenesis of the development of calcification, the



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arachnoiditis present during the injury has not been discussed, because the search query in pubmed also reflects the issue of Cauda equina calcification from this perspective (https://pubmed.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/?term=Cauda%20equina%20calcification) 3. For addition, it is possible to add a pathogenesis scheme describing the mechanism of Cauda equina calcification 4. Make references to sources of literature in the text of the manuscript according to the requirements of the journal. In general, the given clinical case will be in demand by the scientific medical community.
