### SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

The authors reported a rare case report of spontaneous fracture of titanium mesh cranioplasty in a child. Although the case is rare, I doubt the indication of the second surgery in a child who was only aged 8 with a synthetic titanium mesh graft material. In my opinion, the titanium mesh may experience an anticipated force due to the growing process of the skull of the child. Although the authors tried to address this point, it was not detailed. Discussion is not thorough and may be misleading. Besides, particular information of the case was not reported clearly. Language is another problem. For example, "cranioplasty titanium mesh" should be replaced with "titanium mesh cranioplasty"; "craniotomy" should be replaced with "craniectomy".
